Getting the right devices into the hands of students

At the start of the pandemic, Waterbury had a limited number of computers to go around. Several of their 30 schools had as few as two per building and providing 1:1 learning devices for each one of their 19,000 students just wasn't possible.

But Waterbury Public Schools didn't just require devices. They also needed access to educational software that could keep students engaged while giving teachers control over how the devices were being used.

To meet these needs, Nick Chapman, the Senior Network Specialist on Waterbury's IT team, allocated funding for the purchase of a number of Lenovo Chromebooks. Not only are Chromebooks affordable and user-friendly, but every device comes with a free, one-year LanSchool Air licence.

He rolled out the devices as part of a pilot scheme and was immediately impressed with how straightforward and easy to use the technology was. He could manage everything from a single platform and maintain and update every device on the network remotely.

One of the first members of staff to take part in the pilot was English teacher Lucille Rivera. Before the rollout, she noticed that the students who were quiet in the physical classroom were engaging even less in a remote setting.

"On Google Meet they were afraid to turn their camera on, afraid to unmute and talk", she said, "There was no way for me to communicate with them until LanSchool". Now, they simply send a private message if and when they need help – and they can get the 1:1 support they need.

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Engagement went up from the second we were able to use LanSchool. Now [students] constantly ask me to view their screen to make sure that what they're doing is on track with my expectations.




Delivering successful outcomes

Due to the overwhelming success of the pilot programme, Waterbury was able to secure funding for additional Chromebooks. Having the ability to try the software out for a year made it much easier to get buy-in from the board of education.

"It's hard for us to get funding for software without knowing the merits", explained Nick Chapman. "And after the success teachers have found with the software, when the free licences expire, I bet the district is going to allocate budget to purchase licences going forward."

As Waterbury continued to buy devices, they made use of almost 10,000 free LanSchool Air licences across 14 schools. All in all, Nick estimates the bundle offer saved the district around \$20,000 in classroom management software licensing over the last year.
